FLORIDA -- With eleven complex constitutional amendments on the November general election ballot, many Floridians are already looking for information about what they mean and their potential impact, if passed. League speakers are well-informed about the issues and amendments that will appear on the ballot, and they are standing by to help voters gain the knowledge they need to cast an informed vote this elections season.
