REGISTERED TO VOTE YET? TIME'S RUNNING OUT AS OCTOBER 9 DEADLINE LOOMS

vote yet? If you haven't, be warned. Time's running out. You have just a few short days until the October 9 deadline. If you haven't registered by 5:00 p.m., October 9, you're out of luck. You won't have a vote on Election Day, November 6. Your voice won't be heard on decisions that matter to you and your future.

The League of Women Voters of Florida has made it easy to register and stay informed. Need to know how to register or find your poll location? Prefer to vote early and want to know how and where? Need info on state candidates and justices? Want help understanding what the ballot amendments really mean? Check out election information at BeReadytoVote.org or www.vamosavotar.org, one-stop sites for voter

information.

Following are answers to questions students often ask about registering to vote:

Q--How do I register to vote?

A--It's easy. Just go to BeReadytoVote.org, and download a Florida voter registration form. Fill it out. Mail it in. You must do this before Florida's voter registration deadline: 5:00 pm, Tuesday, October 9.

Q--Should I register based on my college address or my hometown address?

A--You have the choice of using either your college address or your hometown address. If you haven't registered to vote at your hometown address, you must register using the address where you are actually living on Election Day. Your decision about where to register depends on what you consider to be your legal, permanent address. Since, as a student, you may move often, your hometown address may be more permanent than your school address. If, however, you are independent of your parents, your school address may be more accurate. Remember, you can only be registered at **one** address.

Q--If I am already registered in Florida, but I have moved recently, can I still submit a change of address up until Election Day?

A--Changes of address are easy to do online or by phone, but to avoid delays you should submit your address change to your local Supervisor of Elections office at least 10 days before the election.

Q--Can I vote on campus if I do not live on campus?

A--On Election Day, you must vote at your assigned precinct, which is based on your address. Check your voter registration card for your precinct number and then go to your local Supervisor of Elections website for the location of that precinct.
