## LEAGUE ADDS MOBILE WEBSITES FOR MORE ACCESS TO ELECTION GUIDE

Need information to help you  
make your decisions about next  
week's election?

With a complicated and long  
ballot facing Florida student  
voters, the League of Women  
Voters of Florida has made its  
nonpartisan 2012 Election &  
Voter Guide more accessible  
than ever. In addition to using  
the League's QR code, mobile smartphone users can access the Voter Guide via two new mobile  
websites:

The League's Guide presents pro/con arguments on the 11 constitutional amendments, covers the issue of merit retention of Supreme Court justices, and provides profiles of candidates for president and Florida U.S. Senate.

For students who need to update their voter information before they vote, the League has made it easy to contact their supervisor of elections, no matter where they live in Florida. One call is all it takes to be ready to vote, but students need to call soon to be sure their information is entered in time for the election.

Because Florida's election laws have changed, it will be particularly critical that students update their address information with their local elections office. Otherwise, they could be handed a provisional ballot on Election Day, November 6.
