This is a historic election year, and the League of Women Voters of Florida Education Fund encourages college voters to get engaged in the democratic process by taking these four easy steps:

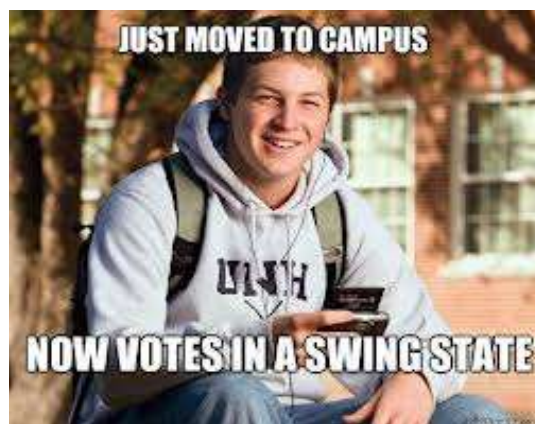
1. Call your local [Supervisor of Elections](#) and give them your current (not your parent's) address so that you can update your voter registration and cast a ballot where you are living now. P.S. Urge your friends to do the same!

2. Go vote! Click [here](#) to learn the early voting hours and locations in your area. Take your student ID and/or drivers' license with you. Note: your ID does NOT need to have your current address on it; just your picture!

3. Caught standing in line at the polls? Use your smartphone to study the candidates and issues on your ballot. Visit: www.BeReadyToVote.mobi or www.VamosAVotar.mobi (en español) to get nonpartisan information about the presidential, congressional and judicial candidates that you'll be voting on, as well as the state constitutional amendments.

4. Make history! Will 2012 be the year of the youth voter? YOU have the power to make that happen! Don't be left out; be ready to vote!
